PERSONNEL MANAGEMENT, RELATIONS:

- 1) The annual South Bay Firefighters' Association BBQ was held at the Odd Fellows Park on July 11th and a good time was had by all. Thanks to Amber Sullivan and Ernest Smith for coordinating this event!
- 2) On July 22nd, Chiefs VanCamp and LeMay and District Secretary Stumpf met with Pamela Kant of WHA Insurance regarding managing and monitoring claims processes with Washington Department of Labor & Industries, and impacts on the District's experience premiums ratings.

EQUIPMENT & FACILITIES:

- 1) Apparatus & Equipment:
 - a. Testing of all District hose was conducted by a contractor on July 10th and 31st.

- 2) Facilities:
 - a. After evaluating four bids for the North Olympia Station 8-3 fire protection upgrades (phase II) project, KCL Excavation was selected as the contractor; the primary scope of work is the construction of a large water tank replacing two old above-ground metal tanks.
- 3) Information Technology:
 - a. 17 active work stations, 1 on-site server, with overall “health” at 88%.
 - b. 13 reactive and 6 proactive service orders for the month.
 - c. 32 users have multi-factor authentication enabled.

25 YEARS AGO: In the July 2001 District Monthly Report:

- On July 12th the Boards of both North Olympia FD7 and South Bay FD8 met for discussions on potential merger/consolidation where they directed their respective fire chiefs to develop a report addressing financial, operational and legal points of such an action.
- On July 19th, the District officially terminated its rope rescue program, known informally as “Rescue 8”; the program had been inactive for some time.
- Representatives of the District attended a memorial service for four US Forest Service responders who died on July 10th at the Thirty-mile Fire in Eastern Washington; the service was held in Yakima.
- There were 49 calls during the month, for a total of 309 year to date.
- On July 27th, the District responded to a double-fatality motor vehicle collision that also had two other patients requiring ALS intervention, both of which were air-lifted to Harborview Hospital in Seattle.

The District will evaluate its progress with the *District Five-Year Incident Readiness & Response* (“IR&R”) *Master Plan* (2024-2028) implementation process and determine if any adjustments are indicated for (a) recruitment, (b) selection, (c) on-boarding, (d) initial training and (e) deployment of both volunteer and career responders into the District IR&R force. The goal is to have 25 volunteer and 28 career responders by the year 2028 that will meet requirements for round-the-clock staffing of South Bay Firestation 8-1 and North Olympia Firestation 8-3.

-  1) Chief LeMay will oversee the implementation of volunteer and career hiring and promotional activities commensurate with the Master Plan approved by Chief VanCamp for 2026 events by December 2026. Complete.
-  2) Chief LeMay will provide Chief VanCamp a “strength, weakness, opportunity and threats” analysis of the Master Plan efforts during 2025 to determine what, if any, changes to assumptions, planning or implementation are indicated, by June 2026. Complete.
-  3) If any changes are indicated, Chief VanCamp will consider the recommendations and develop relevant recommendations for Board review and approval by September 2026. Fire Chief reviewed and approved Resident Responder Program plan for final Board recommendation. Consideration being given to potential outcomes of ongoing regional collaborative discussions with Lacey Fire District 3.
-  4) Chief VanCamp will continue to provide monthly data for on-duty and response statistics to the Board and provide trend analysis to determine impacts from the implementation of the Master Plan. Ongoing.

The District's Community Outreach Team ("COT") will continue to develop and refine its delivery of community education and risk prevention activities while exploring opportunities to increase public interaction to improve District transparency and support community resiliency to hazards and risk.

- 1) Secretary Stumpf will provide Chief VanCamp an "strength, weakness, opportunity and threats" analysis of the COT efforts during 2025 to determine what, if any, changes to planning or implementation are indicated, by March 2026. Complete.
- 2) Secretary Stumpf will provide Chief VanCamp a list of specific deliverables intended to expand two-way communications between the District and the community, by May 2026. The communications should include feed-back processes from customers regarding their satisfaction with District services. Complete.
- 3) Secretary Stumpf will provide Chief VanCamp a consensus based proposal on potential programs that could be offered by the District to improve community resiliency to hazards and risk (e.g. fall prevention, fire prevention, preparations for storms, first-aid/CPR training, "Fire-Wise" wildland-urban interface protection, etc.) by July 2026. Complete.

Recognizing that high quality service depends on the fitness, training and operational readiness of its responders, the District will investigate, examine and promote member access to (a) proactive physical and mental health training, (b) team mentorship and positive cultural alignment, (c) routine peer support, (d) regular physical and mental examinations/assessments and (e) member and their immediate family engage in the District's wellness culture.

-  1) The District Safety Committee under the direction of Chief Hall will conduct a broad survey and review of existing organizational health & wellness initiatives that could be applicable to a District-sponsored program and provide a report to Chief VanCamp by April 2026. Complete.
-  2) The District Safety Committee under the direction of Chief Hall will conduct a survey of members regarding input on a) their interest in potential health & wellness support activities (e.g. physical training, nutritional support, social engagement, etc.), b) their interest in potential peer support for physical and mental health and c) their interest in potential physical and mental health examination/assessment opportunities and provide a report to Chief VanCamp by July 2026. Follow-up survey issued during the month, results to be tabulated for presentation to Fire Chief in August.
- 3) Based on the reports submitted (from objectives #1 and #2), Chief VanCamp will convene an ad-hoc committee with representatives from a) the South Bay Firefighters' Association, b) IAFF Local 2903, c) the Board and d) senior District management to develop a long-range strategy for implementation of an integrated, durable and member-centric health and wellness program by October 2026. Any significant budgetary implications could be considered for the District's 2027 annual budget.

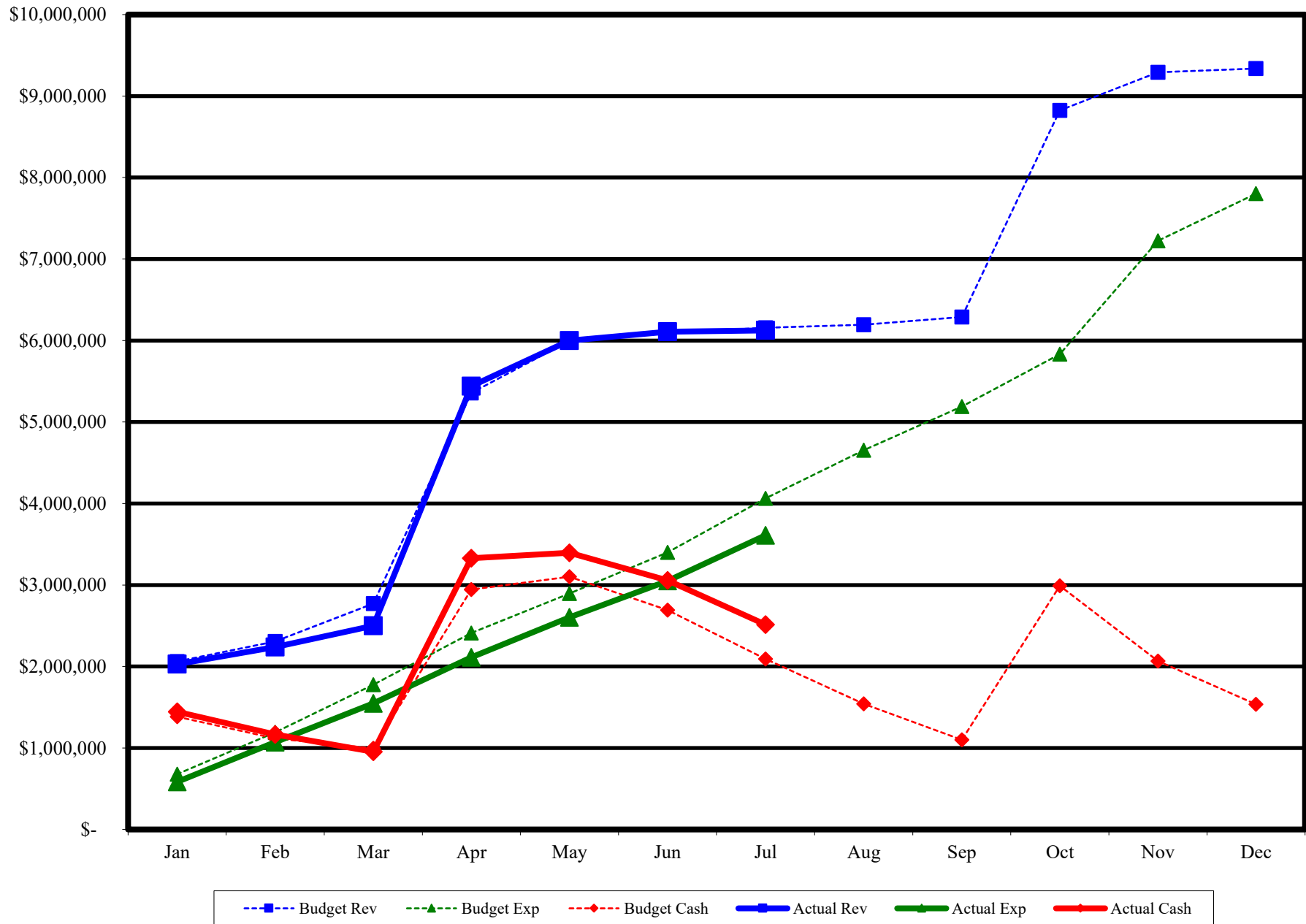
