SAFETY TIPS FOR USING FIREWORKS

As of this printing, fireworks will be allowed in unincorporated Thurston County this Fourth of July; however, discharge is strictly limited to July 3rd and July 4th ONLY between 9 a.m. and 11 p.m. Residents are urged to be very careful with fireworks. Follow these safety tips when using fireworks:

*Make sure fireworks are legal in your area before buying or using them.

*Never allow young children to play with or ignite fireworks.

*Always have an adult supervise fireworks activities. Parents don't realize that young children suffer injuries from sparklers. Sparklers burn at temperatures of about 2,000 degrees - hot enough to melt some metals.

Avoid buying fireworks that are packaged in brown paper because this is often a sign that the fireworks were made for professional displays and they could pose a danger to consumers.

- Never place any part of your body directly over a fireworks device when lighting the fuse. Back up to a safe distance immediately after lighting fireworks.
- * Never try to re-light or pick up fireworks that have not ignited fully.
- * Never point or throw fireworks at another person.
- * Keep a bucket of water or a garden hose handy in case of fire or other mishap.
- * Light fireworks one at a time, then move back quickly.
- * Never carry fireworks in a pocket or shoot them off in metal or glass containers.

* After fireworks complete their burning, douse the spent device with plenty of water from a bucket or hose before discarding it to prevent a trash fire.
