

# DISTRICT MONTHLY REPORT: MARCH 2019

## ADMINISTRATIVE:

- 1) On March 18<sup>th</sup>, the Board and senior staff met to review the status of key strategic initiatives and projects. One outcome was the creation of a committee to develop an executive performance evaluation process that would include aspects of the District (as a whole), the Board and the Fire Chief.
- 2) The Board and senior staff met on March 25<sup>th</sup> to begin planning for the upcoming negotiations for the renewal of the District's Collective Bargaining Agreement with IAFF Local 2903; the current agreement expires as the end of 2019.

**PERSONNEL MANAGEMENT, SAFETY & TRAINING:**

- 1) Current Training Topics:

- 2) Medic-One OTEP:

- 3) Leadership:
  - The IR&R Integrated Decision Making Team, now referred to as the “Operations Team”, met on March 7<sup>th</sup> and discussed a number of policy, training and personnel issues. The team is scheduled to meet monthly.
  - Chief VanCamp, Assistant Chief LeMay and Chief EMS Officer Clemens attended the Washington Fire Chiefs’ Leadership Conference held at East Olympia FD6 Station 6-1 on March 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup>. The topics of the conference included collective bargaining and labor law.
- 4) Other:
  - Lieutenant Osborne began equipping District response apparatus with inflatable personal flotation devices (“PFD”) for personal to don when near water hazards.

**PERSONNEL MANAGEMENT, RELATIONS:**

- 1) Candidates for career Dayshift Firefighter-EMT were interviewed on March 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> as part of creating a new register for the position. This is in response to a potential need to fill vacancies created by the career Lieutenant process.

**EQUIPMENT & FACILITIES:**

- 1) Apparatus & Equipment:
- a. In preparing for the sale of the Libby Road Firestation, the Oil Spill Response trailer was relocated to Station 8-2.
  - b. Tender 81 received repairs on its pump relief valve, and Tender 83 was shopped for brake issues.
  - c. During the month, Lt. Pawlowski coordinated the testing of touch-free infrared thermometers in the field.
  - d. Scheduled preventative maintenance on the District's radio equipment was started during the month. Kevin Paddock of Thurston County Fleet Management is performing this work under contract.
  - e. Engines 82 and 83 had minor maintenance work conducted this month.
  - f. Equipping of District apparatus with the new low profile personal floatation devices continues (Engine 83 being the latest).
  - g. Battalion 82 vehicle had its transmission repaired (4-wheel drive out) and its side door graphics touched up due to fading of the paint.
  - h. The radio-module in Aid Unit 83 was misbehaving and is being checked out by the OFD shop crew.
  - i. The District's hydraulic extrication tools received preventative maintenance during the month.
  - j. The required amount of large diameter hose ("LDH" - 5-inch) has been acquired and is now available at both Station 8-1 and 8-3. 800 feet of LDH is carried on each pumper.
- 2) Facilities:
- a. The final closing and sale of the Zangle Road Firestation was completed during the month. The Libby Road Firestation site is planned to be placed on the market in April.
  - b. The overhead apparatus bay door for Engine 81 quit working during the month. It is the original door installed when Station 8-1 was built in 1995. Lt Hall is working on obtaining bids to repair or replace components as necessary. The Utility 83 overhead door at Station 8-3 is also requiring repairs.
