Phase II Master Plan Report: A summary of the preceding month:

Commissioner Harper and Chief VanCamp worked on a draft summary report of the Master Planning Phase II, "Facilities & Deployment", for Board and organizational review and adoption. The report covers project goals & values, historical perspectives on facilities capital planning and factors affecting it, an assessment of the current facilities & deployment situation, identification of future needs, summary of the three primary strategies ("three response stations", "two response stations" and "two response stations with a central stand-by facility"), the long-term vision for facilities & deployment and specific objectives. A special Board meeting will be held on June 1st to work on the draft which will then be considered at the next regular Board meeting on June 12th.

Phase III Master Plan Development: A summary of the preceding month:

Commissioner Harper and Chief VanCamp worked on draft plans for the next phase of master planning, addressing specific business functional areas for the District. A summary of the plan will be presented at the June 1st workshop.

PUBLIC RELATIONS & COMMUNITY SERVICES:

1) RECOGNITIONS: Medic One Director Kurt Hardin and BLS Coordinator Anna Lee Drewry presented Assistant Chief Brent McBride; Lieutenant Travis Osborne and Firefighter Jacob Zvirzdys CPR Live Saving Pins during the May 8th regular Board meeting.



They, along with Firefighter Chris Pawlowski, Engine Crew 35 from Lacey FD3 and Medic 4 from Olympia FD successfully revived a patient in cardiac arrest on March 23rd. The patient recovered and actually visited our crews after being discharged from the hospital. *Definitely an outcome we like to see! Good work team!*

- 2) AN IMPORTANT STORY NOT REPORTED LAST MONTH: Shortly before 7:00 on Saturday, April 14th, Laila Edwards, a 4 years old, noted smoke coming from the eaves of a neighboring house. She immediately informed her mother, Angela, who then called 911 and roused the sleeping occupant to evacuate the smoke-filled house, which did not have any working smoke detectors. Because of their timely actions, arriving firefighters were able to quickly extinguish the kitchen fire that had extended into the attic, limiting further damage to the structure. Laila was recognized by the District at a special ceremony at Station 8-1 on April 22nd. *Good work Laila!*
- 3) The South Bay Elementary School Fun Fair was held on Saturday May 19th and the District provided representation for the community.
- 4) The dayshift crew assisted in a tour by the Sequoia Treehouse Pre-school on May 23rd. *Thanks again for your help guys!*
- 5) During their regular meeting held on May 8th, the Board discussed option regarding funding for master planning objectives. For the primary objective of sufficient staffing for two firestations, a proposal for placing a ballot issue on this Fall's General Election for a regular levy restoration (from the current \$1.34 mil to \$1.5 mil) and lid lift (from 101% to 106% for 5 years) was discussed. Chief VanCamp will provide information on these options at the June regular Board meeting.

3). This was in response to performance at large scale incidents in the county last year.

- 2) Chief VanCamp attended the Washington State Fire Chiefs' conference in Kennewick during May 21-25.

EQUIPMENT & FACILITIES:

- 1) Apparatus & Equipment:
 - a. Engine 81 was returned from the repair shop during the month and placed back into service.
 - b. Due to a vendor discontinuing business, the PPE cleaning extractor at Station 8-3 is temporarily placed out of service until a new soap vendor can be secured.
 - c. Station 8-1 had a minor fire alarm problem during the month; the vendor corrected this issue the next day.
- 2) Facilities:
 - a. Vendor TCMS has begun preventative maintenance on the HVAC system at Station 8-3 during the month.
 - b. Lieutenant Hall has been working with Thurston County Resource Stewardship Department on the inspection and re-certification of the storm-water retention system at Station 8-3 during the month. Some potential maintenance requirements may result from the work.
- 3) Lieutenant Osborne has been working with Janet Notarianni on the input of facilities and equipment data into District *Emergency Reporting* files for inventory control and setting up preventative maintenance plans.
